Students are annually tasked with meeting a real-world brief, based on a specific site. The site is selected based on the city in which the previous year's winner is located. The top three students in 2020 were from Cape Town, so the 2021 brief is set there. The brief requires students to create a design to develop the historical Strand Street Quarry as an attractive tourist destination and connection hub along the city's planned Heritage Route.
