

# SA's top Twittering editors

Prompted by a <u>Twitter discussion</u> with journalist Jonathan Ancer (<u>@jonathanancer</u>) earlier this week and a comment by *Business Day* editor Peter Bruce (<u>@Bruceps</u>), who urged <u>more South African executives to join Twitter</u>, I decided to track down some of South Africa's top editors and compare how they were faring in the world of Twitter.

Encouragingly, many of SA's news editors are already active on Twitter, although there are still several who are noticeably absent. It is also worth noting that the past couple of weeks have seen huge editorship changes in the SA media, including those at <u>Rapport</u>, <u>Beeld</u>, <u>Finweek</u> and now <u>Sowetan and Daily Dispatch</u>.

#### Top of the list

At the top of the list of active editors (by follower numbers) is *City Press*'s Ferial Haffajee (<u>@ferialhaffajee</u>), with more than 10 000 followers. *City Press*'s recent allegations of a <u>secret Julius Malema trust fund</u> no doubt boosted her follower numbers, as did her <u>very public spat</u> with (now former) *Sowetan* columnist Eric Miyeni.

Close behind Haffajee is the *Mail & Guardian*'s Nic Dawes (<u>@NicDawes</u>), with more than 9000 followers. Dawes is more active on Twitter than Haffajee, ahead by about 3000 tweets.

In third place is *Sunday Times* editor Ray Hartley (<u>@hartleyr</u>), with just over 4200 followers. Hartley started tweeting on 21 August 2007, though, way before both Dawes (1 June 2009) and Haffajee (21 November 2009).

At the other end of the scale, editors who have not yet joined the fray include the editors of *Sowetan*, *Business Report*, *Cape Times*, *Die Burger* and *The Herald*.
