

AAVEA to co-host first annual IAAPA SA Summit

Global attractions industry professionals will come together for a six-day experience in South Africa during the International Association of Amusement Parks and Attractions (IAAPA) EMEA Summit 2020. Taking place on 27 January to 27-February 2020 - in Johannesburg and Cape Town - the event, co-hosted by the African Association of Visitor Experiences and Attractions (AAVEA), will give attendees a unique and in-depth experience around the country.
