

Zuma released on medical parole

South Africa's jailed former president Jacob Zuma has been placed on medical parole because of his ill health, the government's correctional services department said on Sunday.

The statement issued by the Department of Correctional Services (DCS) confirming Zuma's release yesterday said: "Medical parole's eligibility for Mr Zuma is impelled by a medical report received by the Department of Correctional Services. Apart from being terminally ill and physically incapacitated, inmates suffering from an illness that severely limits their daily activity or self-care can also be considered for medical parole."

Last month prison authorities said Zuma underwent unspecified surgery and was in hospital with more operations planned.

However, the details of medical report and his condition remain confidential.
