

GBCSA set to ReWire thinking on sustainability

The sixth annual Green Building Council South Africa (GBCSA) Convention & Exhibition will take place at the CTICC from 16-18 October 2013. In response to sustainability trends and market demands, the event has been reinvented with a new theme, 'ReWire'.



ReWire is all about renewing, refreshing, innovating, shifting paradigms and connecting like minds. Underpinned by the theme, several new exciting side-events will take place as part of the convention and exhibition offering.
