

Kfm 'Music Saves The Day' drives daytime listening

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Kfm 94.5, the number 1 commercial radio station in the Western Cape, is bringing to life its positioning of 'The most music. Feel great' through its latest workplace-listening marketing campaign.



The new campaign celebrates the positive role music plays during the time of staying at, and working from, home. Music is also Tracey Lange's first love. "I come from a very musical family," she says. "All my uncles and aunts either sing or play in orchestras. So, my initial interest in music was classical. Today my love of music and different genres is vast. Music is like that best friend who knows what to say and do.
