The committee chose 62 films among the 1063 received.

Kammakastig Land by Brandon Oelofse and *The Cabin* by Brynach Day has been retained to be part of the African program of short films which will be screened during the festival.

48 schools from 25 countries from five continents will be represented through 12 programs of films that will be offered to spectators.
