


Zaid Adams appointed chairperson of StreetSmart SA

He also has extensive international hospitality experience having worked in the United Kingdom, Europe and Africa. He has served on the board of Fedhasa and is a member of the Chaine de Rotisseurs since 2007.

In spite of the significant constraints imposed on the hospitality industry by the Covid-19 pandemic, StreetSmartSA has 71 partners nationally that continue to support its vision of creating viable lives for the country's most vulnerable children, many of whom live on the streets. Funds are raised through StreetSmart partners by adding a R5 donation to a patron's bill. This donation is voluntary and donors are able to contribute more if they wish to.
